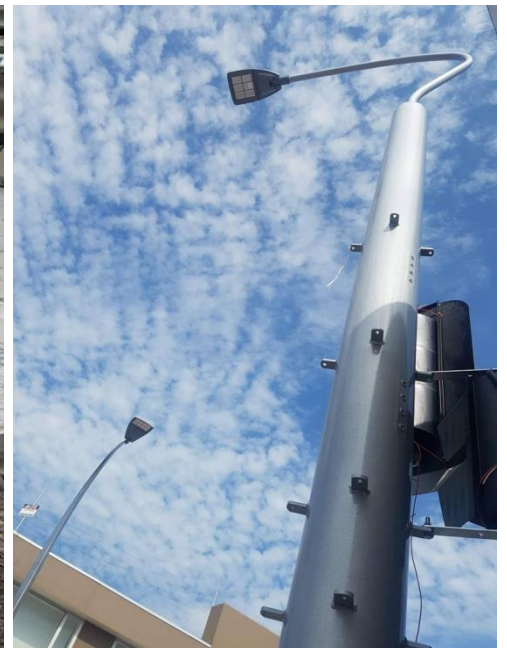
Works on Young Street works are now well advanced. The majority of works will be complete by the end of October 2017.

By the end of October you'll see:

- vehicle traffic using Young Street in both directions,
- traffic lights operating at Wells Street and Station Street,
- bus operations relocated back to Young Street at upgraded bus stops,
- new paving in place directly outside shops along Young Street's west side,
- kerbside parking reinstated on Young Street.

Street furniture on Young Street

Street furniture including bins, benches, bicycle hoops, drinking fountain, light poles and bollards are currently being installed on Young Street.



Paving on the shop side

We have finished concreting on the shop side of the footpath from Balmoral to Ross Smith Avenue and from Ross Smith Avenue to Beach Street. We will continue to lay pavers in front of shops during night works.

Please follow the paths that are created to walk safely around our work zone. We appreciate your patience during this period and are working hard to minimise the inconvenience.

Tree planting

In the coming weeks, we will start tree planning. We will be planting Cotton Palms along the middle on the median strip and Plane Trees and natives in other areas.

Night works

Night works will continue with the laying of corrective level asphalt (mostly on the western side) to ready the road for the introduction of two way vehicle traffic in late October.

There will also be footpath paving on the shop side in front of shops.

Activation events

We are currently planning activation events for the re-introduction of buses and two-way traffic to Young Street. These events will encourage people to visit the area and shop in Frankston. We'll provide more information on these activities in the next weeks and also advertise them widely within Frankston and surrounds.

Business as Usual competition

As part of the Business as Usual campaign, the State Government is working in partnership with Frankston City Council and the Frankston Business Network for an in-store shopping competition throughout October and November. You should have been visited by representatives from the Frankston Business Network last week. The Young Street Improvement Project is one of several major redevelopment projects happening in Frankston City.
